Division 1 – Trumpet Daffodils

(Trumpet as long as or longer than perianth segments)

- 1. Yellow Trumpet, perianth yellow, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 2. Bicolour Trumpet, perianth white, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 3. White Trumpet, perianth white, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 4. Any Trumpet variety, 1 bloom.

Division 11 – Large Cupped Daffodils

(Cup more than one third, less than equal to perianth segments)

- 5. Perianth coloured, cup coloured not paler than perianth, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 6. Perianth white, cup coloured, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 7. Perianth white, cup white. one variety, 3 blooms.
- 8. Any large cupped variety, 1 bloom.

Division 111 – Short Cupped Daffodils

(Cup not more than one-third length of perianth segments)

- 9. Perianth coloured, cup coloured not paler than perianth, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 10. Perianth white, cup coloured, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 11. Perianth white, cup white, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 12. Any short cupped variety, 1 bloom.

Other Daffodil Divisions and Classes

- 13. Division 1V Double Narcissi, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 14. Division 1V Double Narcissi, one variety, 1 bloom.
- 15. Division V Triandus, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 16. Division V1 Cyclamineus, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 17. Division V11 Jonquilla, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 18. Division V111 Tazetta Hybrids, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 19. Division 1X Poeticus Narcissi, one variety, 3 blooms.
- 20. Miniature daffodils (not more than 2 inches/5cm in diameter) one or more varieties,

3 blooms.

- 21. Five daffodil blooms, trumpet and large cup, any varieties, one vase.
- 22. Daffodils, six varieties representing not less than three divisions, one stem of each, one vase. **TULIPS**

(Classes 23 - 25; three blooms to be exhibited in one vase in each class)

- 23. Tulips, single, one variety, one colour.
- 24. Tulips, single, two or more varieties.
- 25. Tulips, double, one variety, one colour.
- 26. Mixed Tulips, five blooms, one vase.

OTHER BULBS AND FLOWERS

- 27. Hyacinth, one bulb, any colour, grown in a bowl or pot.
- 28. Hyacinths, three bulbs, any colours, grown in a bowl or pot.
- 29. Hyacinths, cut, vase of three spikes.
- 30. Violets, cut, one bowl or vase.
- 31. Spring bulbs, one bowl or vase, of any type not mentioned above, cut.
- 32. Auriculas, one bowl or vase.
- 33. Forget-me-nots, one bowl or vase.
- 34. Iris, three stems, any variety or varieties.
- 35. Polyanthus, one or more varieties, one bowl or vase.
- 36. Primroses, one bowl or vase.
- 37. Pansies or violas, six blooms.
- 38. Wallflowers, mixed, one bowl or vase.
- 39. Wallflowers, one colour only, one bowl or vase.
- 40. Cacti or succulents, one bowl, pan or pot.
- 41. Pot plant for foliage.
- 42. Flowering plant, in bloom, in pot not exceeding 6 inches / 15cm.
- 43. Flowering plant, in bloom, in pot exceeding 6 inches / 15cm.
- 44. Primula grown in bowl or pot.
- 45. Shrub, one variety, one bowl or vase.
- 46. Shrubs, more than one kind, one bowl or pot.
- 47. Bowl or vase of cut spring flowers.
- 48. Any other exhibit of horticultural interest not covered in this section and only one entry. Any container should not exceed 12" /30cm.
- 49. One Azalea, pot grown.
- 50. One Alpine plant, flowering, pot grown.
- 51. One Orchid (plant).
- 52. One pot (maximum 10 inches / 25cm), Daffodil / Narcissus, one variety, in flower.
- 53. One pot (maximum 10 inches / 25cm), Tulips, one variety, in flower.
- 54. Camellia, three blooms, one or more varieties.
- 55. Bonsai.
- 56. Best flower stem from your garden

VEGETABLES

- 57. Cabbage, with 50mm of stalk, one.
- 58. Lettuce, frame or cloche grown, with root, one.
- 59. Mustard and Cress, one container.
- 60. Radishes, bunch of six.
- 61. Rhubarb, three sticks.
- 62. Spring onions, six.
- 63. Any other fruit or vegetable not mentioned above. Only one entry.

FLORAL ART

(Natural plant material must predominate)
