Warner Trophy – for the best exhibit in Floral Art at the Summer Show.
(Presented by W D Warner).

Claydon Trophy – for the most points gained by a lady at the Summer Show.
(Presented by R W Claydon).

Cramphorn Trophy – for the most points gained by a gentleman at the Summer Show.
(Presented by Messrs Cramphorn Ltd.).

Presidents Salver – for the best exhibit in pot grown classes- 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 31.
(Presented by the family of RS Biscoe)

RHS Diplomas – may be presented for the best exhibit in each of the following classes:

Flower classes other than roses.
Fruit and Vegetables.
Homecraft

FLOWERS ROSES

(Roses are classified below as Large Flowered Hybrid Tea (LF), Cluster Flowered (CF) or Dwarf Cluster (DC). Classes 1 – 5, No buds allowed).

1. Five blooms, one or more varieties (LF).
2. Three blooms, two or more varieties (LF).
3. Three blooms, one variety (LF).
4. One bloom (LF).
5. Two blooms (LF).
6. One variety (LF), three stems showing successive bud, exhibition and fully open stages.
7. Rambler, three stems, one or more varieties.
8. Climbing, three stems, one or more varieties.
9. Three stems, one or more varieties (CF).
10. Three stems, one or more varieties (DC).
11. Bowl of mixed roses (bowl not to exceed 12 inches / 30cm).
12. Box of specimen blooms, two or more varieties.

SWEET PEAS

13. One vase of six stems, one variety, one colour.
14. One vase of six stems, two varieties.
15. One vase of nine stems, one or more varieties.

OTHER FLOWERS AND PLANTS

16. Delphiniums, one spike, no side shoots.
17. Pinks, six stems, one or more varieties.
18. Vase of flowers, three to twelve stems, one kind, excluding above classes.

19. Flowers raised from seed in the twelve months preceding this show, three to twenty stems, one kind, excluding sweet peas.
20. Pansies or violas, six blooms
21. Stocks, three stems
22. Cactus or succulent, pan or pot.
23. Pot grown plant in flower other than cacti or succulent.
24. One pot grown plant for foliage only, other than cacti or succulent.
25. Any other item of horticultural interest not covered in this section and only one entry. Any container should not exceed 12"/30cm.
26. Pot grown Pelargonium (Geranium), poy not to exceed 10"/25cm.
27. One pot grown Regal Pelargonium.
28. Fuchsia, standard or half-standard, pot grown.
29. Fuchsia, bush, pot grown, pot not exceeding 10"/25cm.
30. One vase of sprays of flowering or berried shrubs (including flowering trees).
31. Two pot plants.
32. A hanging basket
33. Bonsai.
34. Best flower stem from your garden.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

35. Raspberries, one dish of twelve, stalks attached.
36. Gooseberries, one dish of ten.
37. Strawberries, one dish of nine.
38. Collection of three kinds of soft fruit, not less than six of each kind.
39. Rhubarb, three stalks.
40. Carrots, stump rooted, dish of three.
41. Lettuce, cabbage, with root, two.
42. Lettuce, cos, with root, two.
43. Beetroot, one variety, four.
44. Onions, autumn sown, three, dressed.
45. Peas, one dish of six pods, one variety.
46. Potatoes, one variety, five.
47. Shallots, dish of nine.

- 48. Broad Beans, dish of six.
- 49. Cauliflower, with 50mm of stalk, two.
- 50. Cabbage, with 50mm of stalk, two.
- 51. Spring Onions, green, salad, six.
- 52. Radishes, bunch of six.
- 53. Collection of vegetables, four kinds, numbers as for single classes, space 2 feet/60cm square.
- 54. Mini-collection of vegetables, four kinds, one of each, space 2 feet/60cm square.
- 55. Any other fruit or vegetables, not mentioned above. Only one exhibit.

FLORAL ART

(Natural Plant material must predominate)

- 56. Arrangement in a thimble.
- 57. Basket of summer flowers.
- 58. Oasis cushion of flowers and trimmings.
- 59. Gentleman's buttonhole.
- 60. Spray for a lady.
- 61. Posy.
- 62. Details in Newsletter.

JUNIOR GARDENER

(Under 16 years old. Please state age on entry).

- 63. Flowers in oasis, size not to exceed 10inches / 25cm.
- 64. Six iced cakes, small
- 65. Anything home grown.
- 66. Anything handmade in the last six months.

MECRAFT

- 67. Jam, soft fruit, one glass jar.
- 68. Jam, stoned fruit, one glass jar.
- 69. Brown bread loaf.
- 70. White bread loaf.
- 71. Chocolate Cake, chocolate iced, own recipe.
- 72. Fruit Cake, own recipe.
- 73. Victoria Sponge Sandwich, jam filling.
- 74. Bread pudding, four pieces, men only.
- 75. Ginger Cake, own recipe.

- 77. Sausage Rolls, six.
